Mt. Halla (Hallasan)

Hallasan is a shield volcano constructed atop the continental shelf. Rising 1,950 meters above sea level, it is the highest mountain in South Korea. The Baengnokdam crater lake in the summit, a group of volcanic rocks collectively called Yeongsilgiam, and 40 or so oreums (parasitic cones) combine into a unique volcanic landscape.

Geomunoreum Lava Tube System

Over 160 lava tubes are scattered throughout Jeju Island. The Geomunoreum Lava Tube System refers to a series of lava tubes formed by large amounts of basaltic lava spewed out from Geomunoreum volcano as they ran 13 kilometers down towards the coast. Included in the system are Bengdwigul, Manjanggal, Gimnyeonggul, Yongcheondonggul, and Dangcheomuldonggul lava tubes. Each lava tube features unique characteristics, which were critical in Jeju's designation as a UNESCO World Natural Heritage site.

Seongsan Ilchulbong Tuff Cone

Also called Sunrise Peak, Seongsan Ilchulbong is a tuff cone formed by a Surtseyan-type underwater eruption about 5,000 years ago. Rising 182 meters, the tuff cone dominates the eastern seashore of Jeju like a gigantic ancient castle. The huge bowl-shaped crater is well preserved, and various geological structures can be observed on the sea cliffs.

2) Jungmun Resort → Local Road 1132 → Namwon → Pyoseon → Seongsan (get off) → Seongsan Ilchulbong
3) Seogwipo → Local Road 1132 → Namwon → Pyoseon → Seongsan (get off) → Seongsan Ilchulbong

Heukdwaeji-gui (Grilled black pork of Jeju)

Jeju black pigs are grown cage-free. The meat is tender and nutritious. Grilled to perfection, black pork is deliciously chewy and has little fat.

*This unique dish of Jeju is offered in many restaurants throughout the island.
*Prices may vary by region and restaurant, but it costs around 15,000 won per person.



Seongge Miyeokguk (Sea urchin soup)

Seongge, or sea urchin, is harvested by women divers of Jeju. A bowl of seaweed and sea urchin with its eggs carries scents of the sea. Traditionally, sea urchin soup has been made on special occasions or banquets.

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Galchi Yori (Hairtail fish dishes)

Galchi, or hairtail fish, is commonly caught in Jeju, and it is cooked in various ways. Galchi-hoe is slices of freshly-caught raw hairtail fish; galchi-guk is soup made with green pumpkin; galchi-gui is grilled hairtail fish; and galchi-jorim is hairtail fish simmered in a spicy sauce with radish.
